Knowing Christ

Peter writes that we "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." 2 Peter 3:18

Now Peter is writing to group of believers who already "know" Jesus as their Savior. By this we mean that we have recognized we have sin in our lives which separates us from God (Rom. 3:23) and we need a Savior. Sin is so pervasive and dominate in our lives that we could never rid our lives from it or pay God back for the damage done to our relationship with Him. We need a Savior and that is Jesus. So when we acknowledge our sin and ask Jesus Christ to forgive our sins He does and we come to know Him as our Savior. Do you remember the glorious day that took place in your life or are you experiencing the joy of being forgiven?

Since Peter is writing to believers who have already experienced this beginning "knowledge of Christ" and he challenges them to "grow in grace and knowledge" we can be sure there is more to this relationship. Last month I commented on Jesus' words to his followers to "abide in Him to produce much fruit". Jesus would never tell us to do something impossible so as we pray to Him, learn from Him, rely on Him we discover He provides what we need to live productive, fruitful lives. This is a life long learning but it is possible to know Christ in a way that provides the essential spiritual nutrients to life a fruitful life.

In his earlier book Peter called his readers to desire the Word "like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual mild, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation." I Peter 2:2. We come to "know Christ" by consuming a steady diet of the Word where we learn who He is, how He loves us and how He desires to work in our lives. Many believers wonder why they don't feel closer to Christ or experience the spiritual vitality others seem to have. The answer often is right here. They spend little time in the Word and thus are spiritually weak and weary. I suggest you follow Peter's advice and regularly, daily, and even more than that spend time in the Word. Read, meditate and memorize so the Word is able to "dwell in you richly" (Col. 3:16).

So much more could be said, but press on. You truly can Know Christ more and the relationship seem closer and your faith become stronger.

Ben was talking to our kids the other day about love languages.

I'm sure you have heard about love languages. The five different love languages according to Dr. Chapman are: words of affirmation, quality time, physical touch, acts of service, and receiving gifts.

Now, Ben was talking to our kids about mommy's love language which is not included in that list. Mommy's love language is obedience from her children. Ben told them that when they listened to Mom and did what she asked (the first time—not the 100th time), then that would speak love to mom.

It made me think of God and how we speak love to Him. God is love (1 John 4:16) and God is a jealous God (Exodus 20:5-6) and wants His children to love Him only. So how do we show love to God? There are many different ways, but like my love language from my children, God wants obedience from His children (Luke 9:23, Psalm 128:1, Romans 12:1, Deuteronomy 8:6). Obedience may look different for everyone, but it starts with listening to the Holy Spirit and when He asks you to do something — DO IT (don't question Him for the 100th time)!!

We had a missions moment from the Keystone Project recently and the gentleman that spoke, talked about how his wife and him felt called to sell everything and move to Keystone, SD to work in missions. And they did it!! And God has worked incredibly in their lives!

Jesus displayed obedience to His Father when He went to the cross for us. In Mark 14:36 He says: "Abba, Father, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

What is God calling you to do? Where in your life do you need to be obedient and say, : "Not what I will, but what You will"? Obedience to God's calling, shows our love and commitment to Him. It may also


Fairest Lord Jesus



Training Pastors in a Pandemic

Little White Church, Thank you so much for your continued support of my missionary work with TTI! We recently completed our West African Pastors conference which looked pretty different this year due to the continued impact of the pandemic in West Africa. The COVID crisis hit West Africa much harder than we expected so the completion of the conference was delayed until just a few weeks ago, but I'm happy to report it was a great success. Rather than meeting for a single week-long intensive, we had the pastors gather for two shorter teleconferences with small group studies in between. I'm happy to report 80 pastors completed both studies and 5 are now studying to take comprehensive exams to complete their 5 year bible certificate with TTI.

Almost all pastors in this area are not paid for their work as pastors. Most pastors work as day laborers and do their pastoral work in the evenings and on Sunday mornings. The temptation to dishonesty and greed is huge in this subsistence culture. These pastors also face severe persecution from a very cultic strain of Islam which is dominant in their country. Local cults terrorize churches and vandalize their properties. Worst of all one day a year the cults kidnap Christian children to force them into the cults. Local pastors have often spoken of their fear of preaching against the cults, and how their TTI studies are teaching them how to endure persecution. Thank You for helping these pastors!

Glorifying God

What is the purpose of human existence? The Westminster Catechism answers that it is to "glorify God and enjoy Him forever." How can we glorify God when He is already awesome and perfect and glorious?

A lifetime of glorifying God is not just for those who achieve fame (glory) as evangelists, preachers, singers or writers. Perhaps you remember Brother Lawrence who

"practiced the presence of God" as he performed cleaning tasks, or maybe you know of Marva Dawn, who traveled, taught and wrote as a theologian in spite of painful physical handicaps. You have probably not heard of Stanton Richardson, who taught at Crown College, then spent a lifetime praying for and encouraging former students. My parents were among his students and I know you haven't heard of them. They spent a life of service among the Tarahumara people of northern Mexico.



There are other ways of glorifying God. Every thought, attitude and action of our lives can adorn the Good News and bring honor to the name (reputation) of God.

I read in the letters of the apostle Paul, "whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." I Corinthians 10:31 (NIV) Also, Colossians 3:17, "whatever you do or say, let it be as a representative of the Lord Jesus, all the while giving thanks through Him to God the Father." (NLT)

Before we think or say anything, or act, we can ask ourselves the questions in the March 18 daily reading in the book My Utmost For His Highest, put together by Biddy Chambers from the sermons of her late husband, Oswald Chambers: Is this attitude, thought or action in harmony with the nature of God? Is it in agreement with the life of the Son of God in me? Will it grieve the Holy Spirit?

We can learn to develop gratefulness as a habit, remembering to thank the LORD, who gives us breath. We can practice glorifying God with every breath.


