I thought it was time to give an update on the Youth Ministry that we have meeting on Wednesday evenings. It has been a good year and we continue to see new youth showing up on a regular basis to check it out. With High School and Middle School combined we average 48 youth each week. Add around 12 leaders to this and you have 60 plus people that are being fed supper each week. Jacque Pennel

does a great job of organizing the meals, but we depend on you the congregation for donations of Walmart gift cards and food items to make this all possible. There is a sign-up for anyone to donate specific food items with the given weeks that those items are needed. Donations for the meals have been slow in coming this year, so I thought I should bring some attention to it. We are very grateful to those who have given in the past and continue to contribute on a regular basis.

We have spent this year in the book of Mark studying the life of Jesus. The youth have been getting to know how He lived His life and interacted with those around Him and the ministry that grew up around Him. Many of our youth that attend are from unchurched families and are hearing about Jesus and who He is for the very first time. It's been fun seeing their reactions and questions to what they are learning about.

There are some big changes coming this year to the Youth Ministry. I will be announcing tonight to the youth that we are dividing the Middle School from the High school youth. We have been seeing a decline in the attendance of High School youth on Wednesday's and a big part of this is that our Middle school group has grown so large, it has become overpowering on Wednesday Nights.

Starting April 11th, 9th-12th grade will have their own Youth Ministry that will meet on Sunday Evening's from 6:30pm-8pm. The 6th-8th grade youth will continue to meet on Wednesday's from 5:45pm-8pm. They are able to come right after school at 3pm on Wednesdays to hangout as normal. For the rest of this year the High school youth are welcome to continue to meet on Wednesday's as they currently do with the addition of the ministry on Sunday evenings.

Adding another night of ministry is going to take more work and volunteers and yes, my article last month was about being too busy and guarding our calendars and setting time aside for family, so you could say I am not doing a very good job of following my own advice. We will also need more leaders to accommodate the new night especially if we are able to start growing the High School back in numbers by offering them their own night. Please see me if you have any interest in becoming a leader or to help supervise. There are multiple roles available in this ministry.

One final note is that we are going to continue the youth ministry into the summer on a weekly basis. This will be a scaled down version meant

to keep a connection with the youth and have a safe place for them to continue to meet. We have a mission trip to Enid, Oklahoma being planned for June 7th- 11th and some other activities for the youth to be involved in, so please be in prayer for this ministry and for those who serve in it. Thank you for being a church that loves our youth and is so committed to the youth ministry. The youth can feel how welcome they are here in this church body.

Their hearts are here – their heaven is earth. If not forced over the cliffs by death, many would said "a few more hours" for all eternity."

"It is when they begin to see things in this concussed way — God, heaven, holiness as a treasure — that things get dangerous. Humans in this condition have been known to do more damage to our Father's kingdom than ten thousand of those who, for all their talk, just want a few more hours. Men have sung on their way to the gallows. Women have crossed oceans to tell news of the Enemy to subjects we thought firmly in our grasp.

Heaven must remain — if it must remain — as merely the next best thing when they are evicted from this earth. Keep heaven in the peripheral: a hazy, undesirable existence of floating in clouds and plucking harps. Let them think they are praying "on earth as it is in heaven" when they really mean "in heaven as it is on earth."

Far from fainting at such a belief, we see in it the opportunity to glorify our Father Below. When they refuse the Enemy's feast to check on the fields and oxen they bought, or when they excuse themselves because they just got married and need a few more hours, all see the truth. How those howls shook hell when that young rich man — and every rich man since — finally turned away dejected.

So yes, dear Globdrop, allow heaven to be "reasonable" to your man, at least for now. But never allow it to be more. Let him contest for the idea of heaven and drop the thought once he sits down to eat lunch, scrolls mindlessly through his phone, or watches a movie with his girlfriend — send him immediately back to our world. The only heaven we can endure — and the only heaven that will deliver your patient safely to us — is the heaven for which no one really wants to leave earth."

Anticipating Life's Waves

Joni Eareckson Tada, who was paralyzed after a diving accident, described swimming in the ocean as a child. Because the waves looked so high, her first inclination was to swim away from them. That, however, just left her tossed about and sometimes held underwater. "The best thing," she discovered, "was to swim fast toward [the waves] and dive under them before they had a chance to break on top of you."

That's true with life's "waves of crisis or difficulty" too, says Tada. "The best way to beat those waves of trials and tough challenges is to face them. Head-on. Almost anticipating them. Sometimes I find myself literally diving into the middle of a problem before it has a chance to crash on top of me." When problems are about to break on top of you, what helps you face them and stand your ground?


