That in itself is not the challenge but the anger that is expressed toward anyone who doesn't respond like I do is the problem. Fortunately I have observed most of our congregation responding with Grace to opinions different from our own. Lets keep pursuing Grace.

Jesus promised he came to provide us with Peace and I am quite convinced our evening news is designed to create a turmoil of anxiety. When you lay your head on the pillow each night are you able to rest in His Peace or does the anxiety of the uncertainty destroy your rest. I may catch this virus and even die from it, as some friends of mine have, but I choose to rest in the Peace of a Lord and Savior who watches over me day and night. Some days that requires reciting verses of His peace to still my heart.

Challenging days are always opportunities to grow. In this season allow Jesus to grow your Faith, Grace and Peace.

"The Gospel According to Paul" by John Macarthur is a new addition to the LWC library. What a joy it is to read Paul's "focused passages in his letters to the early church that summarize the gospel message in just a few well-chosen words. Each of these key texts has a unique emphasis highlighting some essential aspect of the good news". The author quotes scripture, brings scripture form other parts of the Bible and puts together what Paul taught in his letters to the early churches about the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The chapters begin with 'Things of First Importance' and Luke 24:46-47: It was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise the third day, and that repentance and remission of sin should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning in Jerusalem. Paul insisted there was no other gospel than the one he had taught, and that the atonement was at the center—Christ died for our sins, and that He was buried and resurrected on the third day, and many people witnessed Him alive.

The author, like Paul in Romans, knows we need 'The Bad News'. Gal. 3:22: The Scripture has confined all under sin, that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe. "It's good to remember that Christians are nothing but redeemed sinners—saved from condemnation not because we are somehow better, smarter, more worthy, or more acceptable to God...Without Christ, we would be completely under the command, control, dominion, and damning power of sin." Macarthur find 13 charges in Romans 3:10-17, every one of them a direct quotation from the Old Testament, as an indictment against us. The summary of verse 18: There is no fear of God before their eyes. The verdict?

The chapters continue with—How can a person be right with God?, Sola Fide—Not by works of Righteousness, The Great Exchange, Alive Together with Christ and The Lessons of Grace. In this last chapter, Macarthur warms against legalism as the folly of pharisaism and antinomianism as the error of the present age. Speaking of the later, he writes—"some of today's antinomians seem determined to discover pietistic moralism practically everywhere. They are worried because they fear other Christians are too worried about being right and doing right. They seem to think the whole point of the gospel is to eliminate the sinner's concern about righteousness altogether...It is spiritually irresponsible and dangerous to suggest that it is inherently moralistic to cultivate a hunger and thirst for righteousness (cf. Matt. 5:6)"

Appendix 3 is 'The Reason for Everything'. "God does what He does in order to put His glory on display. As a matter of fact, everything is made to serve that same end. It is God's ultimate purpose". Appendix 4 is 'Paul's Glorious Gospel'— adapted from sermons by C.H. Spurgeon.

This book has so much scripture and so much of what God has done for us in Christ—that it will bless your socks off!

The Glory of Jesus: In His holy character

The miracle of the impossible fishing was what caused Peter to recognize the glory of Jesus in His holy character. From The Message, Luke chapter 5, Jesus was using Simon Peter's boat for a pulpit as He taught the crowd. "When He finished teaching, He said to Simon, 'Push out into deep water and let out your nets for a catch.' Simon said, 'Master, we've been fishing hard all night [the best time to fish] and haven't caught even a minnow. But if You say so, I'll let out the nets.'"

You may have read the account; a huge haul of fish, overwhelming everyone at the scene with awe.

"Simon Peter, when he saw it, fell on his knees before Jesus. 'Master, leave. I'm a sinner and can't handle this holiness. Leave me to myself.'"



The Glory of Jesus: In His transfiguration

Peter had the privilege of seeing the glory of Jesus in His transfiguration. From The Message, Matthew chapter 17, "Jesus took Peter and the brothers, James and John, and led them up a high mountain. His appearance changed from the inside out, right before their eyes. Sunlight poured from His face. His clothes were filled with light."

Peter wrote about this later in his second letter. "We saw it with our own eyes: Jesus re-

splendent with light from God the Father as the voice of Majestic Glory spoke: 'This is my Son, marked by My love, focus of all My delight.' We were there on the holy mountain with Him. We heard the voice out of heaven with our very own ears."

Peter recognized and saw both the glory of Jesus in His holy character and the glory of Jesus in His transfiguration.


