First of all, let us say that we miss visiting you this year! We always enjoy reconnecting with you and getting to share in the joy of Jesus' birth at Christmastime. We were needed here to take care of some responsibilities, but, Lord willing, we hope to come to South Dakota next year!



We have been enjoying the faithfulness of God and the ways that we see His promises at work. As many of you know, last fall we were in a leadership transition, with Andrew serving as the 'Interim Director' while we sought the Lord for whom He would bring in for the Well, as time long-term. went by, we realized the prayer for а Director seemed to disappear from our minds, and God has

made it clear over the past several months (both to us and the Canadian Torchbearers Board), that Andrew is the permanent one for the role!

With the Lord's leading and peace, we are excited to officially direct the centre for as long as God desires. At the same time, CQBC has reached another exciting juncture; through prayer and consideration, it has become clear that Capernwray Quebec has reached a point of maturity that allows us to start the process of legally separating from the Canadian centre in British Columbia (who started the centre in Quebec 25 years ago), in order to form and establish CQBC as its own entity. J The founding centre in BC has supported, loved, and guided CQBC all of these years, and will continue to do so. However, it is now time for us to seek the Lord afresh for the plans and purposes He has specifically for this centre in Quebec. We look forward to see all that God will do at CQBC through us and many others who will be involved in this process!

Many of you this month will receive Christmas cards depicting angels as chubby toddlers with little wings on their shoulders. I don't find anything in the Bible that describes angels this way. Rather, they are awesome spiritual beings, "messengers swift as the wind, servants made of flaming fire." [Hebrews 1:7, NLT] No wonder their appearances are frequently alarming.

Angels worship God for His holiness. They call out, "Holy! Holy! Holy is the LORD Almighty! The whole earth is full of His glory!" [Isaiah 6:3, NLT] In the New King James version, Isaiah goes on



to say that the doorposts were shaken by the voice of the angel. That is a mighty powerful voice.

We might be tempted to worship angels. The apostle John was, but the angel said, "Stop at once! Don't do that! I serve God! I serve those who keep His word. Worship God!" [Revelation 22:9, My paraphrase]

The angels worship Jesus, recognizing Him as the unique Heir of the Father, Creator and Sustainer of the universe, the One who has the Name above all names, is King above all kings and is Light of the world. "Life itself is in Him and this life gives light to everyone. The light shines through the darkness and the darkness can never extinguish it." [John 1:4,5, NLT] Jesus said later in John's gospel, "I am the light of the world. If you follow Me, you won't be stumbling through the darkness, because you will have the light that leads to life." [Jn. 8:12, NLT]

The entire universe of rational creatures will one day bow before Messiah Jesus and make the declaration that He is LORD, to the glory of God the Father.

My love for my Bride Mary matured beyond any expectations I could have ever deamed of. I now believe this was only because of God's Agape Love for Mary through me to her.

I know this from my experiences of.... Service to my Bride.

Acts of kindness to everyone and from you.

New medical relationships.

Awareness of limited time we all have in our lives here on this earth and blessings of eternal lives in the future forever.

Our struggles and difficulties here on Earth bring us to a point that we cannot do these things ourselves without you, Jesus!

Increased awareness of Mary's needs, physically and emotionally, she knows that I cannot fix many things. I just need to hold her, reassure her, and listen to her.

Increased awareness of how she completes me and what life might be like without her here with me.

We still request your prayers as we go forward on the journey. We pray that the cancer will not return in some other way or other part of her body. She will still be having 1 to 5 years of pills and shots. Her lymphedema in her left arm because of the loss of lymph nodes from the cancer surgery will remain the rest of her life. We are blessed that we have, thanks to Medicare, a pneumatic compression pump drainage system that gives her treatments 50 minutes every day and it minimizes and stabilizes fluid buildup in that arm.


