Focus on Missions - BOLT

BOLT completes first year

BOLT, the after-school children's club under the umbrella of Pioneer Clubs, came to a close at the end of April with a meal and special program to acknowledge the accomplishments of children grades K-5. BOLT stands for Bible-centered, Outreach focused, Life skills learned and Transformation experienced. Despite the normal challenges of a first-year program, the leaders welcomed children who were excited to come each week and experience activities associated with the Bible, life-skills and games.

The elementary children were accompanied by two adult volunteers every Wednesday as they walked from the school to the Little White Church. After a snack, these children were ushered into the sanctuary for an opening, scripture memory, music and a Bible Story, told by Becki Groven. Then they were divided according to age, and went to either small group Bible time, games or life-skills.

The five Bible story units during the past year were: Who is God?, Unwrapping Christmas, Who is Jesus?, Putting God First and Easter. Children worked on several passages of scripture associated with the units, repeating the passages each week, sometimes learning them through special songs.

Life skills units were: Outdoor Cooking, Baking, Secret Codes, First Aid and Woodworking. Many knowledgeable, capable leaders from within the church were enlisted to give of their time and energy to teach the children valuable life skills.

During the course of the year, the average number of children each week was 38, with 25 percent coming from the Little White Church and 75 percent from the larger Hill City community. Involved regularly in the planning and teaching were Becki Groven, Sarah Walker, Cindy Dusing, Jacque Pennel, Lynn Edwards, Sherry Liddell, Kim Herman, John Bandel, Cole Kosmala, Carol Walker, Lauren, Jessica and Elise Row, Gavin Nonnast and Ben Schock.

Cindy Dusing commented, "The leaders have done an amazing job of sharing God's love with our elementary kids. Our prayer is that all the kids would know how much God loves them, and desire to follow Him."
