

My last article started with "Summer is coming to a close and school is just around the corner." As I am writing this, we are five days into school and sport teams have already begun to compete. Many have plans to get away one final time over Labor Day weekend getting in one last bit of summer, but I am not saddened to see summer go. I enjoy it and many things it brings, but for me I love the change of the season as we go into fall.

Many visitors and tourists ask me the best time to come to the Hills. I personally love the month of September. We have the best weather in September and I enjoy putting on a sweatshirt instead of sweating in a t-shirt. It's hard to beat the changing of the leaves in the Black Hills. Yes, the change in season does lead to the dreaded winter season, but as I reflect on how nature changes I realize how we have no say in how nature will act or determine the seasons to be.

Change is always hard, but we seem to be able to make the necessary adjustments to live in harmony in those changing times. It seems The Little White Church has been going through constant changes since Covid took the world by storm. We stopped meeting in person for a couple months in order to keep people safe while trying to get an understanding of what was going on. This church body stepped up and was supportive and great at adapting to everything that was being thrown at it. After Covid seemed to be getting under control another change happened. A great migration of people moving to South Dakota.

I won't take the time to discuss all the reasons behind this, but it has brought over 90 new people into our church in the last year and a half. This church has grown over 40% in a very short time span. There are not any manuals on church growth that I am aware of to help navigate such a rapid change. In response we tried having an overflow area in the Fellowship to watch the services and then made the change to two services for the Summer.

As you are aware we are continuing into the Fall with two services and will be adjusting the service times yet again to 8:30am and 10:15am. I know many were hoping to return to one service, but as we continue to meet new people in search of a church almost weekly, we find ourselves almost out of room yet again. Change seems to be the new constant in the season we are finding ourselves in.

What we need from the church body is continued support and adaptability. I know what it's like to be part of a church your entire life and then see it change very rapidly. It can be scary or discouraging as you struggle to see your place in it. My hope is that you will look to see what God is wanting to do through all of this change. Get to know these new families. The people that are walking through these doors making this their church home are incredible people who genuinely love the Lord. I have been blessed by many of them already in getting to know them.

Another need as you have been hearing is volunteers. We are looking at the possibility of 40-50 kids in Sunday School K-5. We do not know what the new schedule of having two services with Sunday school is going to bring, but I do know that we do not currently have the teachers necessary to minister to that number of kids. We need more leaders and helpers for BOLT on Wednesday's from 3pm-5:20pm and we currently do not have a Director of Nursery and are very short in volunteers for Nursery.

These are three core ministries that we cannot let down. It's time to evaluate where our priorities lie and how we spend our time. My hope is that families once again embrace the importance of being in church, having their kids in Sunday School and serving in some capacity during Sunday morning or participating in an adult class themselves. Let's get back to giving God our time, respect and honor by devoting our Sunday's back to Him and let whatever else that is pulling us away on Sunday take a back seat where it belongs.

Waiting on the Lord has been something we have experienced a blessing from in more than one instance, but it was really apparent when we tried to move to Hill City the year before we actually moved here. We had placed an offer on a home on Deegan Drive and then came out to the car and prayed about the offer - prayed that God would close the door on this if there was anything that wasn't right about it...timing, finances, etc. Everything was a green light right up to the night before we were to leave Nebraska and come sign the papers on the house. That night we received a call stating the loan had been denied. It was denied because I had only been self-employed for 8 months and the loan required 12. It was the first time in 18 years that a loan of this type had been denied for this reason. We took the news in stride and the Loan Officer was surprised we were not mad. We simply replied that we had prayed after making an offer that God would close the door if there was a reason we shouldn't buy the house. We felt this was a pretty solid door closure and stated "You can't ask God for something and then be angry when he gives you the answer. When the timing is right, we'll be back." He was shocked. During the next year, before we moved here, Gary was diagnosed with lymphoma and his mother passed away. Because we were still in Nebraska, we had the family support team we needed to see us through both issues. God is so good to all of us if we just wait on Him!




Songs of Worship in Times of Suffering



There, in those pages, I can become lost in the promises that God made to humanity. Locked away from the heartbreaking images projected by this fallen world. Safe in my Father's arms, I am content to be . . . on the threshold of a dream.

Power in Weakness

In the late 1970s, Henry Smith was struggling to find work after finishing his education. He also lived with a degenerative disease that caused him to become legally blind. But one day he heard a pastor explain that Jesus became poor so we might become rich through him. This idea inspired Smith to craft a song of thanks for God's gift of Jesus. Though Smith wrote more than 300 songs, only this one became widely known (sometimes labeled "author unknown" or misattributed, but finally rightfully credited to him).

"Give thanks with a grateful heart," the song begins exuberantly. One of its most poignant lines urges, "Let the weak say, I am strong ... because of what the Lord has done for us." Across two millennia, Smith's words and faith echo the apostle Paul: "[The Lord] said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me" (2 Corinthians 12:9, NRSV).
