"You are my Lord, my goodness is nothing apart from You." Psalm 16:2

If you think you have nothing to offer the Lord, consider the early Freewill Baptist evangelist, David Marks. One day he rode his horse into Ancaster, Ontario, announcing he would preach. A crowd gathered, and Marks asked if anyone had a topic to suggest. A man mockingly said, "Nothing!"

Focus on Missions - SIM

Hi Little White Church with a big heart!

We are so grateful for your support and prayers, especially through this last year of unexpected surprises.

Many of our hopes and plans this year have gone completely haywire, as I'm sure many of yours have too. Before COVID and Mary Beth's medical emergency, we had planned on spending 2020 going on scouting trips to the coast with potential teammates to find God's will for where to plant a future church. We hoped to have everything planned out by December, when we were going to go to North America and inform supporters. Since the borders were closed to return to Peru after MB's surgery, we decided to stay in North America and visit supporters as well as we could in the midst of the Pandemic, taking into account our need to move slowly so MB could properly recover.

During the last few months we've watched COVID numbers continue to rise around North America and have been wondering how we can visit supporters and churches as things shut down again. Simultaneously, we've been watching Peru numbers continually decrease as the country reaches herd immunity. The borders opened near the end of October and friends began to tell us about how everything had gone back to normal. With this in mind, we've prayerfully decided to go back to Peru and try to accomplish our original, pre-home assignment goal of finding a location and team for church planting. Our current idea (we no longer make plans!) is to leave for Peru on Saturday Nov. 28th. We hope to come back to North America in July for home assignment.

Currently, Sarah and Zach are in medical school in Chicago, attending virtually. It's not ideal, but they really are learning a lot. Ben is a senior in textile sciences at the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, Mia is in her sophomore year in pre-physical therapy at Pacific Azusa University and Paul is working at his aunt's veterinary clinic in Michigan.

Christmas Card Joy

You may be receiving cards this time of the year that mention JOY. You might even get one that has the word JOY spread over the entire cover.

The Bible has a lot to say about joy, but it is not joy manufactured by us, or produced by our surroundings. It is supernatural joy!

Psalm 90 "Satisfy us in the morning with Your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our lives."

How can we be glad, sing for joy, rejoice always, when the darkness of our circumstances is smothering us?

We can, because we worship the Joy-Giver. It is His supernatural joy that we possess, based on Him and Who He is, not based on our circumstances. The LORD, the Joy-Giver, specializes in giving beauty for ashes, joy instead of mourning, praise instead of despair.



Three Scriptures demonstrate:

Psalm 126 Restore our fortunes, LORD, as streams renew the desert. Those who plant in tears will harvest with shouts of joy. When the LORD restored His exiles to Jerusalem...we were filled with laughter and we sang for joy.

Hebrews 12 Let us run with endurance the race that God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from start to finish. He was willing to die a shameful death because of the joy He knew would be His afterward.

John 15 & 16 If we stay attached to Jesus as a grape branch is attached to the vine, if we hang on to His love and if we hold fast to His word, just as He did with the Father, we will be filled with His abundant joy.

When you sing the Christmas carol Joy To the World, think to yourself, "This is not about joy over my circumstances, but it is about Jesus and His supernatural joy."




God, I pray for all who are lonely in this season, or exhausted, or grieving. Give them courage as you fill them with the Holy Spirit.
