Burial Spices

Jewish people used perfumed spices when they buried their loved ones. The women had seen Nicodemus bring his gift of spices. They also wanted to show their love for Jesus by bringing a gift. Their gift of spices had probably been prepared on Saturday evening after the Sabbath ended. Burial "spices" were not the same cooking spices we use today. Burial spices were made from pieces of sweet smelling wood which were ground into powder. The powder was added to a thick, gooey mixture, such as myrrh, to make a heavy paste. The paste held the grave clothes together and hardened rapidly. The strong spicy smell covered up the smell of death. The women could have been bringing as much as fifty pounds of spices to the tomb on Sunday morning. But they never got to use their gift—Jesus wasn't dead anymore!

Sunday Sunrise: Look Inside! Matthew 28:1-8, Mark 16:1-8, Luke 24:1-8

The gates of Jerusalem were opened just after sunrise on Sunday morning, the first day of the week. Some of the women, along with Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Salome, and Mary, the mother of James, walked out of the city to the tomb where Jesus had been buried. They brought their gift of burial spices to put on his body.

On their way, the women talked about the stone that covered the opening of the tomb. They asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the tomb for us? How will we get inside to use our burial spices?" The women may not of known about the soldiers who went to guard the tomb on Saturday. These soldiers would have refused to allow the women to go into the sealed tomb. When the women came within sight of the tomb, they saw the stone—it was rolled away from the entrance. They hurried to the tomb and looked inside. There lay the grave clothes, still wrapped but now empty! Where was Jesus? Suddenly two men in clothes as bright as lightning stood in front of the women.

The women were terrified. They bowed down with their faces to the ground. One of the angels said to them, "Don't be afraid. I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. But why do you look for the living among the dead? Jesus is not here! Don't you remember how Jesus told you he would rise? He is alive!"

Speechless, the women could only stare at the bright, shining angel.

The angel said to them, "Remember what Jesus told you. He said, 'The Son of Man must be handed over to his enemies. He must be nailed to a cross. He will die, but on the third day he will rise from the dead.'"

The angel pointed to the burial clothes. "Come and see the place where he lay." The women slowly moved to the stone slab where the white wrappings lay. They could hardly believe their eyes . . . or their ears!

"Now, go quickly!" said the angel. "Tell his disciples and Peter, 'He has risen from the dead. He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.'"

The women ran as fast as they could. Their hearts were full of fear . . . and joy.



From My Files: Echoes of God's Glory

As we are thinking about the Resurrection, celebrated this month on April 12, let's think about Jesus' role as Intercessor and High Priest.



The hymn The Unveiled Christ contains the lines "Now He is with God the Father/ Interceding there for you; /For He is the mighty conqueror/ Since He rent the veil in two."

Scripture tells us that His body is the curtain that was torn. He is the new and living way into the Holy of Holies, where formerly only the high priest could enter once a year. He offered Himself to God the Father as the payment for our treason and treachery and He stands as the go-between to speak to Almighty God for us. This is God's plan in the

new covenant between Himself and His people.

Therefore, brothers [and sisters], since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, His body, and since we have a great Priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for He who promised is faithful. Hebrews 10:19-23 NIV

So, friends, we can now—without hesitation—walk right up to God, into "the Holy Place." Jesus has cleared the way by the blood of His sacrifice, acting as our Priest before God. The "curtain" into God's presence is His body. So let's *do* it—full of belief, confident that we're presentable inside and out. Let's keep a firm grip on the promises that keep us going. "God is not a workaholic"

In Sabbath as Resistance, Walter Brueggemann likens our consumerism-driven society to ancient Egypt. Hebrew slaves made bricks for storehouses for the wealth of the upper class, at the top of which sat Pharaoh. Now, as then, the push is always to do more, earn more, make more; we worry there's not enough time or money. "In this system there can be no Sabbath rest," says the author.

Yet, at the culmination of creation, "God rested on the seventh day. God did not show up to do more. ... God did not come and check on creation in anxiety to be sure it was all working." And "because the creator is anxiety-free," we can be too. "God is not a workaholic," writes Brueggemann. "God does not keep jacking up production schedules. To the contrary, God rests, confident, serene, at peace." God's rest, in turn, gives us — who are created in his image — a "restfulness that contradicts the 'drivenness'" of Pharaoh's Egypt and modern society.

Debt-free, by grace

Visiting with her passenger, Uber driver Latonya Young mentioned her determination to finish college — and a \$700 debt that barred her from enrol-ling in more classes. "Every time I got ready to pay the money, my kids needed something," she said later. "I said, 'Okay, I'll just wait.'"

To Young's great surprise, a few days after that Uber conversation, she learned that her customer, Kevin Esch, had paid her debt; she could reenroll! In response, Young persevered to finish her degree with strong grades. "When he paid the balance, I had to do this for him," she said of Esch, who attended her graduation.

Young's self-sacrifice for her children and Esch's self-sacrifice for a stranger both pale, of course, in comparison to Jesus' sacrifice of his very life to save us. Like Young held back by debt, we were captive to sin until "the Son of Man came ... to give his life as a ransom" (Matthew 20:28, ESV). Young did nothing to earn Esch's gift, and we can do nothing to earn salvation. But as she responded by using the gift to its fullest, we embrace God's gift by living in thanksgiving and praise, love and service.

Create a simple yet powerful Easter display.

What you need:

- 3 wood blocks (small, medium, large)
- Acrylic paint (three pastel colors and white)
- Paintbrush
- Water
- Paper towels
- Letter stencils and tape (optional)

What you do:

- Paint each block of wood a different pastel color. (You can paint the whole block or just one side.)
- 2. When paint is dry, use white paint to write (or stencil) "He" on the smallest block, "is" on the medium block and "risen!" on the large block.
- 3. When blocks are dry, stack them from largest to smallest to proclaim "He is risen!"
