The last three weeks of January we had a guest speaker Brian Johnson, from South Dakota Apologetics, talking with the youth and those from the church body about topics including Evolution, Age of the Earth and Dinosaurs. We all claim the same thing "we don't have any time, we are too busy." I am guilty of this myself (not the cat videos), but the truth is if we actually wrote down on paper where we spend our time, friends, family, TV, internet, smart phone, work, etc. we would be surprised to see how much of this precious life we are wasting. "Can we really choose what we are going to think about? The idea of regularly choosing themes for our thoughts seems strange, but Paul has no doubts that it is possible. He actually commands it. Controlling and directing one's thoughts is a habit, and the more one practices it, the better one becomes at it. Motivation, of course, helps, and Christians have a deep-rooted urge, instinctive to them as regenerate persons, to center their thoughts on God's grace and glory at all times. It has always been common for Christians to let their thoughts be drawn up to God and to meditate – that is, talk to themselves and to God, silently or aloud, concerning God's nature, works, and ways, in a manner that prompts praise and adoration and brings endless delight to the heart. Paul's instruction in what to think about simply gives focus and direction to this regenerate instinct, so as to ensure that our meditation will profit us as much as possible."

Reflect: I can choose to focus my thoughts on God's good gifts.

Romans 15:13 – May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit

"What, in particular, are the true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, gracious, excellent, and praiseworthy things on which we are to center our thoughts? (see Phil. 4:8)? They are the doings of God and the fruit of those doings in human lives. They include the fourfold awareness that

- 1. God loves me, infinitely and eternally;
- 2. everything comes to from God, at least with His permission and al ways under his protection, to further my eternal good
- 3. my saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus, which will eternally increase, is something supremely worth having; and
- 4. the gospel message of salvation that I seek to pass on to others is something supremely worth giving.

These thoughts will always prime the pump of joy in our hearts and thus produce a steady flow of joy, peace and delight. Try it and see!

Reflect: When I focus on God's work in my life, I experience joy and peace.

And bits of 'The Bewildering Call of God' in Oswald Chamber's "My Utmost For His Highest"

Luke 18: 31, 34 - "...'and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished'...but they understood none of these things..."

"God called Jesus Christ to what seemed absolute disaster. And Jesus Christ called His disciples to see Him put to death, leading every one of them to the place where their hearts were broken. His life was an absolute failure from every standpoint except God's. But what seemed to be failure from man's standpoint was a triumph from God's standpoint, because God's purpose is never the same as man's purpose.

...The call of God is like the call of the sea – no one hears it except the person who has the nature of the sea in him.

...If we are in fellowship and oneness with God and recognize that He is taking us into His purposes, then we will no longer strive to find out what His purposes are. As we grow in the Christian life, it becomes simpler to us, because we are less inclined to say, "I wonder why God allowed this or that?" And we begin to see that the compelling purpose of God lies behind everything in life, and that God is divinely shaping us into oneness with that purpose. A Christian is someone who trusts in the knowledge and the wisdom of God, not in his own abilities. If we have a purpose of our own, it destroys the simplicity and the calm, relaxed pace, which should be characteristic of the children of God."

Focus on Missions - Keystone Project

The entire focus of Keystone Project is to provide training directed toward the accomplishment of the Great Commission.

KP does this by training and coaching leaders to launch movements of multiply-

ing disciples in the nations, especially among people groups who have little or no access to the gospel. The demand for the training has grown very quickly with thousands of leaders applying to attend. This is challenging financially and with staffing. A typical training pro-



gram includes 100 - 130 people for a 30 day commitment. To help with these challenges, a new initiative called Keystone Project Partners has been implemented with a website that allows one to give just \$10 per month, which is the price of a single meal or a monthly subscription to something like Netflix.

The March-April 2019 training had a thousand people apply from 44 countries, but KP was only able to accept 80 students from 12 countries. The first ever lvory Coast month long training was completed in 2019 with French translation. This was one of the most impactful trainings ever held. KP has commissioned a team of missionaries to the West African Nation of Cote d' Ivoire which arrived in November to stay within the country for five months. They are committed to supporting the new disciples in reaching every unreached people group of West Africa.

2019 brought in the addition of Spanish translators to our trainings.

KP's **Project Summer Internship** is about equipping young people between 18-25 years of age with experience in making disciples and provides summer employment. In 2019, KP had 7 interns. Three young Native American men of the Lakota tribe, three siblings from Minnesota and one from Arizona.

Total Disciples trained in 2019 was 317!

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



In Other Words

We're so accustomed to hearing the Bible's "love chapter," 1 Corinthians 13, at weddings and other occasions that we may not really hear its meaning anymore. It can help to listen to something familiar said in different words. What new understandings of love does this paraphrase from The Message Bible reveal to you?



"Love never gives up. Love cares more for others than for self. Love doesn't want what it doesn't have. Love doesn't strut, doesn't have a swelled head, doesn't force itself on others, isn't always 'me first,' doesn't fly off the handle, doesn't keep score of the sins of others, doesn't revel when others grovel, takes pleasure in the flowering of truth, puts up with anything, trusts God always, always looks for the best, never looks back, but keeps going to the end. Love never dies" (1 Corinthians 13:4-8a, MSG).

A heavenly focus

"Why are not our hearts continually set on heaven?" asks 17th-century pastor and author Richard Baxter. Focusing on heaven stirs our faith, guards against temptation, eases suffering and makes us an encouragement to others, Baxter says. He urges: "Bend thy soul to study eternity, busy thyself about the life to come ... and let not those thoughts be seldom and cursory, but bathe thyself in heaven's delights."

Married for a mission

Jesus' command to seek first God's kingdom (Matthew 6:33) is a key component of successful, God-honoring marriages, writes Gary Thomas in *A Lifelong Love* (David C. Cook). In fact, Thomas says being "married for a mission" can renew many unions in which partners think they're merely incompatible. "My suspicion is that many of these couples actually suffer from a lack of purpose," he writes. "Jesus' words given to individuals in Matthew 6:33 are perhaps even truer in marriage. When we give away our life, we find it. When we focus outside our marriage, we end up strengthening our marriage."
